

# 2018 Voter Resource Guide

**1. Polls are open from 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM on November 6<sup>th</sup>**

**2. Find your polling place.**

Visit [www.votespa.com](http://www.votespa.com), the Pennsylvania Department of State's online voting information and resource center, and enter your address to find your polling location. You can also call 1-877-VOTESPA (877-868-3772)

**3. Only first-time voters must show proof of identification.**

**Approved forms of photo identification include:**

- Pennsylvania driver's license or PennDOT ID card
- ID issued by any Commonwealth or US Government agency
- U.S. passport
- U.S. Armed Forces, student or employee ID
- Current utility bill, paycheck or bank statement, including your address

**4. Voting is your right as a citizen. If an alleged "poll watcher" tries to impede you at the voting booth:**

- Tell him to kindly step out of the way
- Take his picture with a cell phone
- Call the FBI at 202-307-2767 or toll-free at 800-253-3931

**5. Absentee ballots:**

The last day to apply for a civilian absentee ballot is October 30. Absentee ballots must be received by the County Board of Elections by November 2; postmarks do not apply. To request an application by phone, mail or in-person, contact your County Board of Elections (call 1-877-VOTESPA/877-868-3772 to find your county's information).
