2020 Voter Resource Guide

1. Polls are open from 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM on November 3rd

2. Find your polling place.

Visit <u>www.votespa.com</u>, the Pennsylvania Department of State's online voting information and resource center, and enter your address to find your polling location. You can also call 1-877-VOTESPA (877-868-3772)

3. <u>Only first-time voters must show proof of identification</u>. Approved forms of photo identification include:

- Pennsylvania driver's license or PennDOT ID card
- ID issued by any Commonwealth or US Government agency
- U.S. passport
- U.S. Armed Forces, student or employee ID
- Current utility bill, paycheck or bank statement, including your address

4. <u>Voting is your right as a citizen.</u> If an alleged "poll watcher" tries to impede you at the voting booth:

- Tell him to kindly step out of the way
- Take his picture or video with your phone
- Call the FBI at 202-307-2767 or toll-free at 800-253-3931

5. Absentee/ Mail-In ballots:

The last day to apply for a civilian absentee ballot <u>by mail is October 27</u> or <u>online/ in</u> <u>person by October 30</u>. Absentee ballots must be **received** by the County Board of Elections by November 3 either by mail or in person at your polling place. To request an application by phone, mail or in-person, contact your County Board of Elections (call 1-877-VOTESPA/877-868-3772 to find your county's information).
