OVERVIEW OF THE CURRENT EI SYSTEM

- Children from birth to age five suspected of having developmental delays or disabilities may be eligible for Early Intervention services.
- Early Intervention is Development, not Behavior.
- Behavior Services is through Behavior Support Services

CONCERNS RELATING TO EARLY INTERVENTION

- Cultural factors, language barriers, and stigma associated with disabilities can also prevent families from seeking help early.
- Shortage of qualified professionals in urban areas like Philadelphia leads to high caseloads for existing staff, which may impact the quality of care and the amount of attention each child receives.
- High turnover and burnout rates among professionals can exacerbate these issues.
- Access to El services in Philadelphia can vary significantly based on socioeconomic status, race, and geographic location. Families in lower-income neighborhoods or those with limited transportation options might have more difficulty accessing services.
- Disparities in service quality and outcomes, with some groups not receiving the same level of support as others.


- Special Instruction: Educational services tailored to the child's needs.
- Speech Therapy: Services to address difficulties with speech and language.
- Physical and Occupational Therapy: Services to improve motor skills, coordination, and daily living activities.
- Hearing and Vision Services: Support for children with sensory impairments.
- Nutritional Services: Guidance and support for dietary needs.
- Social Work Services: Assistance with accessing community resources and support for the family.
