Understanding Positive Racial Identity Development in Early Education

The Philadelphia Positive Racial Identity Development Environmental Scan (2023) represents a collaborative research initiative conducted in partnership with the PRIDE Program at the University of Pittsburgh. This extensive body of research builds upon the foundations laid by a similar study conducted in Pittsburgh in 2016. The primary aim of this research is to contribute to the growing body of literature surrounding Positive Racial Identity (PRI) by specifically examining its significance within the Philadelphia early education and care community.
